



Prayer letter for April – December 2016

Dear Friends,

I greet you all in the most wonderful Name of Jesus. We thank God that it has pleased our Father to keep us alive up to date. The year begun well and a lot has been happening and this is the reason for the delay. I have had no time to sit down and write this letter.

Personal Note: - My family is doing well. Our children are doing well. Our grandson continues to make us busy and bring laughter to us all especially the grand mum (Jaja) as they call us in Luganda. We can announce to you that we are expecting a granddaughter in August this year. We are expecting her arrival soon and we love her even before we have seen her.

Jane has continued to register some improvement. She has been asked by her doctor to stop the treatment for Hepatitis C since the virus can no longer be traced in her body as before. She has one more test to take and if it is not found in her system it will be concluded that the virus is completely destroyed. She still takes the drugs that remove the water from her system.

Meanwhile we continue to uphold her in prayer for energy, to put on some weight and complete regeneration of her liver.

We continue to extend our sincere thanks to the body of Christ who have stood with us during this time. As a family we are very grateful and know that your prayers made a difference.

Church Ministry: - The ministers are all doing well and the churches are all good apart from the Churches in Burundi where there is some political turmoil, but we shall not fear, we shall continue to press on until peace is registered in the whole country. Our Father has promised never to leave us nor forsake us.

Since the beginning of this year up to the month of April we visited many Churches holding seminars and encouraging the pastors. During this same month, we had heavy rains that led one of our pastor's house to fall on the ground but thank God that this happened on Sunday when they were all at church and no one was hurt apart from the loss of some of their belongings.

All the churches in the different countries are progressing well and growing. The team of Joshua group is working well for the God's kingdom in overseeing the Churches in the

Different parts of the Country. The plan is that we shall develop similar teams in the different Countries where we have Churches.

Leadership School: - 34 leaders in training will be completing their course later this year. We are excited at this and are beginning to plan for the next school which will start next year in January 2017.

PROJECTS: -

CARING FOR THE SICK:-

Kairos Medical Centre is doing extremely well. This evidenced by our clients who have continued to trust us for all these years. We are also committed to give them our best as we continue to minister Christ's love to them. We don't have any other Job other than to love these needy people.

Kairos Hospital continues to do well although it has not yet broken even financially but we believe we may see this happen before the year ends.

Our greatest need is to have the 1st floor built so that we can have enough room for the admissions and the Administration offices. As well as protecting the building from deterioration.

KAIROS HEALTH CENTRE -KIGALI: - The Centre is presently receiving about 90 to 100 patients per day. We are glad that at last this is finally open to the communities around and the Country at large.

KAIROS SCHOOLS IN KAMPALA: - Our schools in Kampala have continued to do well although the numbers of the pupils and the students were not as high as we expected, but a lot has been done in uplifting the standard of these children as well as continual improvement within the school structure. KAIROS SCHOOLS IN KASAMBYA: - The school has picked up very well with a very good enrollment of over 250 pupils this year. The teaching and none teaching staff are all in good spirit.

KAIROS NURSERY AND PPRIMARY SCHOOL IN RWANDA: - It is doing well and we thank God for the support from **Fields of Life** who have agreed to support 150 pupils in school effectively from this 2nd term.

KAIROS FARM: - Work is going on at the farm, although on a small scale. Our prayer is to have a substantial amount of money that can boost the work to

at least a half its capacity. This should contribute some more funds that will be used in the different projects.

KAIROS MAIZE MILL PROJECT- BWEYALE: -

This project delayed to take off due to the lack of the three phase electricity in the area.

We had to pay for the three phase early this year, but Umeme delayed to work on it until the beginning of May. Since they now have the power work has finally commenced.

As communicated in our previous prayer letter, alongside the grinding of maize floor, we shall also conduct discipleship classes for the members to know God and to have a relationship with him.
